NEU Industrial Action Information for Parents and Carers

As you may be aware, the National Education Union (NEU) announced on January 16th that their membership has voted in favour of teacher industrial action. Whilst there will be seven days of strikes in total across the country, our school could be affected by four days of action. For St. Jude's, the four dates of proposed strikes for some staff are: **1 February:** All schools in England and Wales; **1 March**: East Midlands, West Midlands, and the NEU's eastern region; **15 and 16 March**: two-day strike of all schools in England and Wales. I want to reassure you that we will be doing everything we can to minimise disruption to your child's education. The strike does not affect all staff and plans are in place to keep fully open on these dates. In the worst case scenario, if we do need to consider moving to remote learning for some pupils, we will be ensuring those children who most need to be in school can attend. This will include vulnerable children, children of critical workers, and children who are in Early Years and year 6. For now, assume that school is open to all unless you are advised otherwise.
