Children's Mental Health Week 2023

Children's Mental Health Week 2023 will take place from 6-12 February 2023. This year's theme is Let's Connect.

Let's Connect is about making meaningful connections. People thrive in communities, and this connection is vital for our wellbeing. When we have healthy connections – to family, friends and others – this can support our mental health and our sense of wellbeing. For Children's Mental Health Week 2023, we're encouraging people to connect with others in healthy, rewarding and meaningful ways.

We will be starting the week here at St. Jude's with a day of connecting with each other through being active! We will be welcoming Mimi Cesar for a very special 'Stars in School' day. Mimi, a rhythmic gymnast who has twice represented England at the Commonwealth Games, will be working with pupils encouraging them to be healthy and to work together productively whilst sharing her own inspirational story. Mimi has appeared on the CBBC show 'Gym Stars' and the pupils have thoroughly enjoyed her visits here in the past.



On Monday, all pupils in school (including Nursery and Reception) are asked to come to school wearing their PE kit. A polite reminder that this should be dark bottoms, a white tee-shirt/polo shirt and a school jumper. These items should be plain—i.e. no sparkly tops, decorated leggings or anything heavily branded. <u>Homework</u>

Thank you to the vast majority of pupils who complete their weekly homework. It is important that everyone completes the tasks that are set by teachers. Tasks do re-enforce learning that takes place in the classroom but it is also crucial in preparing pupils for the next stage in their education. This includes time spent reading; thank you for the positive response which we have already seen in school after last week's reminder. Getting pupils in to the routine of homework now will save difficulties at secondary school where sanctions such as detentions will be issued when it isn't completed. We are always here to support if advice is needed—please ask.
