Online Safety & Behaviours

It can be very easy online for children to behave in a way that they wouldn't if they were face to face with each other. Talk to your child about how they speak to others online and encourage them to talk to people online with respect and kindness, like they would if they were face-to-face. - Leaving unkind comments
- Sharing photographs of somebody else without their permission
- Excluding somebody on purpose
- Impersonating somebody with a fake account
- Telling/sharing lies



Price Increases

Please be aware of the following price increases:

- The cost of a school meal is going up to £2.60 daily. This change will be implemented from the week commencing June 5th 2023.
- Breakfast Club fees are increasing to £3 if accessed from 7.30am. Arrival at 8.15am or after will be charged at £1.50. This change will be implemented from the start of academic year 2023/24.

I am sure that this isn't welcome news and it certainly isn't something that governors want to do. Last year, City Serve began charging £2.50 per day for a meal and, as a school, we have carried the cost. This is not sustainable now that they have informed us of a further price increase. The price of Breakfast Club has remained low for a long time and, again, school have covered overhead costs. As a school, we inevitably are experiencing the same financial pressures as everyone especially with the huge energy bills which are currently paying.
