Online Safety

You should be at least 16 years old to register for and use WhatsApp. WhatsApp is a free messaging app that allows you to send messages, voice notes, photos and videos.

Group chats: One of the key features is the group chat function. Everybody in the group, even if they are not one of your child's phone contacts, will be able to see all messages within that group. If your child is added to a group with someone that they have previously blocked, that person can still see their messages and send them messages within the group chat. In settings, you can change who can add your child to groups, for example, you can change it to 'my contacts', which means that only those in your child's contacts can add them to a group. You can leave a group chat at any point so talk to your child and encourage them to leave any chat that makes them feel uncomfortable. You can leave groups silently (only the admin will be notified).

Online Bullying: WhatsApp has been used in instances of online bullying, e.g. to send nasty messages or share images of other children without their permission. It is important to have regular chats with your child about their online life and that they understand that they must talk to you or another trusted adult if they are being bullied. Reading

Recently, we had some workshops in school which were very well attended—thank you for your support in working with us to encourage every child to become a reader. We please ask that you record as much information in your child's reading diary as possible/ Where do I record my child's reading? Each child has been given a home reading diary. Please record in there how often your child reads at home, what they are reading and any difficulties they had with their reading. It is always helpful to know if they got stuck on a sound or a word when reading with you at home. If your child has misplaced their reading record please speak to a member of the staff in class. There is a document on our school website which gives some prompts as to what to write in a reading diary if you find this difficult or if you feel that you are being repetitive.
