Absence

There is an increase in the number of parents requesting to take their child on holiday during term time. Staff cannot authorise any holiday requests and the absence is therefore unauthorised. Head teachers can't grant any authorised absence during term-time, unless there are exceptional circumstances. Schools and local authorities can ask for evidence of exceptional circumstances and for evidence of illness if children are off sick. A Penalty Notice may be issued when a pupil has been taken on an unauthorised "leave of absence" from school for minimum of 10 continuous sessions (five days). As a school, by law, we are expected to follow the processes in place for unauthorised absences.



Sunny Weather

Just a reminder to all parents that when the weather is warm and sunny, the children need to have sun hats and sunscreen on to protect them from the damaging effects of the sun. We recommend using 12 hour sunscreen which is applied before school. Staff are not permitted to apply sunscreen to pupils. Could we also ask that the children bring in a bottle of water during the warmer weather.
