Headteacher's Response:

Thank you all for your attendance at Parents' Evening and for completing the questionnaire in such large numbers. I do read all responses. I am pleased to see that parents feel that there are strong relationships in school and that, most importantly, the children are happy here. We will continue to nurture positive relationships with the children who we are blessed to have in our care. The staff will continue to work hard to develop academic and social skills in the pupils. We take on board comments which make recommendations for improvements. In terms of after school clubs, this half-term we have offered Drama, Singing & Stories, Gymnastics and Stay'n'Pray. We plan to offer more opportunities after school in the summer term. Staff do undertake training for their own professional development and we can only offer provision on certain afternoons. We have also provided some opportunities for parents to come in to school after a period of not being able to; these have included class assemblies, phonics workshops and a reception lunch. We hope to offer lots more in the summer term. We have also had our parish mass which many families attended. We are proud of the Catholic ethos of our school and part of this is ensure that we nurture pupils' understanding of other faiths. We do this in many ways—through assemblies, for example, and every year group focusses on a particular faith in the summer term; this includes visits to religious buildings including a Mosque, Synagogue and Gurdwara.
