



## Mr P's Pupil Questionnaire Responses

July 2025

The questions asked were to ascertain the SEND children's views of St. Jude's. 22 questionnaires were completed by pupils at SEN Support / EHCP. Staff members read the questions and asked the children to rate each question. Where children struggled to understand the question, it was rephrased to aid understanding.

### **What the Responses Tell Us**

- The majority of children regularly enjoy school, feel safe in school and are happy.
- The majority of children think our school is a good school and are proud of it.
- The vast majority of children feel that they learn a lot through the curriculum and most children say they know how well they are doing in their learning, but not all the time.
- The children feel supported and listened to by the adults in school who they feel are positive to them and who they feel are interested in their views and opinions. They know who they can go to if they are worried or have a problem they want to share.
- The children recognise they have friends and enjoy their time with them.
- The children are confident to ask for help when they are not sure about something.
- Many of the children feel the benefit of movement breaks and fidgets to help them concentrate.
- Some children are independent and will try hard with their learning by themselves first, but there is still a reliance on waiting for help from adults.
- The children feel happy and comfortable in their classrooms and on the playground and the vast majority enjoy being with their teacher.
- The vast majority of children feel that they are a valued member of our school community.
- Some children like to sit by themselves and other children like to sit by a partner.
- The vast majority of children like to do group activities outside the classroom, but most of the children also like to do tasks independently.
- Most of the children enjoy reading time with an adult.

### **What Are We Going To Do?**

- Work with the children so they know consistently how well they are doing in their learning and what their next steps are so that they can confidently talk about this.
- Where appropriate, ensure there is a variety of tasks to accommodate the children's different preferences for ways of working.
- Build children's resilience and independence in their learning, especially when they find a challenge by teaching them different strategies.
